Principal's Message



Friendly Reminders Current Information Sheets

Thank you to the many families who have taken the time to complete the information



sheets that were sent home on the first day of school. If you have not returned yours yet, please do so as soon as possible. It is very important that we have current information on your child.

Medical Alerts and Forms

If your child requires special care for a medical condition and/or takes medication while at school, please contact the Main Office so that the appropriate arrangements and paperwork can be completed or updated. We appreciate everything you do to help us keep your children safe at school.

Absences

If your child will be absent from school, please inform us by calling the school at 613-336-8991 or 1-800-565-2911. You may call outside of school hours and leave a message (at ext. 100) stating your child's first and last name and the reason for being absent.

Bus Notes

This is an **important** message about bus notes.



Issuing bus notes continues to be an area of great concern. To ensure student safety, any changes to their regular bussing needs to be requested by a signed note sent with the student in the morning. Any changes made by phone

should be done only in an emergency and the school must be notified before 1pm in order to process the change properly and safely. Also, we are no longer able to accept multiple day bus notes. We can only accept bus notes for the current day. Thank you for your assistance. We know how important it is to ensure your child's safe transportation to school.

Bus Stops

Triboard will not allow the drivers to let students off the bus at an unauthorized stop. This means, when you are sending your child to an alternate location, it must already be an existing stop where another child gets on or off. If you would like to arrange for your child to be dropped off at a location that is NOT already an existing stop you must file a Transportation Application Form (available from the office) and wait for approval from Triboard. This process usually takes a day or two.

Picking Up, Dropping Off or Visiting the School
If you are picking up or dropping off your child,
please report to the office rather than going directly
to your child's class. We will be happy to sign your
student in or to call your child down to the office.
Although teachers and staff are always happy to
meet and talk with parents, please remember that
class time or transition time is not a good time;
please call and we can arrange a time that works
with your schedule. Thank you for your
understanding with this matter.

Head Lice

We would like to remind parents to please check their children for head lice on a regular basis. The school conducts routine checks as well and with your help we hope to keep the children head lice free.

Volunteers and Field Trips

Parents who wish to be a volunteer within the school or on a class field trip will need to obtain a current CPIC and have it on file here at the school. If you do not have a Current CPIC (within the last three years) you can pick up a signed request form from the school, complete the personal information and drop it off at the OPP office. When you receive the certified form back from the OPP bring it back to the school and we will keep it on file. Thank you for being willing to volunteer your time and talent.

Portable Speakers

Portable speakers attached to devices like student



phones and tablets have been creating difficulties at school. Music being played in such a manner can be disruptive to classes and quiet work areas. As well, music played through speakers on buses is

distracting to the drivers and is not appropriate given the range in ages of the students who ride our buses. As we did last year, we are asking students not to bring portable speakers for their devices to school. Students can continue to listen to music at appropriate times using headphones, and if speakers for a class related media presentation are required, they will be available for use through the school. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
